## **BUNDLE IN GOOD STANDING**

This short film poetically details the journey of Gabriel's great, great, grandmother, MAH'WAH'TIS', through an unknown land during her tribe's forced exodus from villages in Ohio and Kansas. Mah' Wah' Tis' was a mythic figure among her Delaware Indian people. She was keeper of her tribe's sacred ceremonial dolls.

## 7.30 pm THE MISTERY OF CHACO CANYON

56 mins, Dir. Anna Sofaer

Unveiling the ancient astronomy of southwestern Pueblo Indians, THE MYSTERY OF CHACO CANYON examines the deep enigmas presented by the massive prehistoric remains found in Chaco Canyon in northwestern New Mexico. It is the summation of 20 years of research. The film reveals that between 850 and 1150 AD, the Chacoan people designed and constructed massive ceremonial buildings in a complex celestial pattern throughout a vast desert region.
